HPs Head of Cloud Infrastructure, Steve Dietch Brings Us Back to Earth at NetEvents APAC

Business is just outrunning IT like the bejeebers right now warned Steve Dietch, Vice President - HP Cloud Infrastructure, at NetEvents APAC Press Summit in Malaysia, on Wednesday. Everyone is talking Cloud, but wheres the reality? closing the first days conference session, Dietch brought things back to earth by mining HPs massive global customer base for real life case studies from France, India and the United States. He also offered practical advice on migrating to the Cloud from virtualization to private cloud and hybrid solutions a pragmatic, step-by-step approach:

"The problems I've seen too often -- ten times in the last three months -- is companies too quickly move infrastructure into the cloud without time to improve its credibility Dietch explained. "So my advice is to carve off something such as development and testing, do it fast and then move forward. One message: if you're going to screw it up, screw it up fast so you have time to recover the situation." Dietch also argued against rushing into the Cloud on a pure cost basis, saying that agility and speed would be the prime reason to move from the virtualized environment to private cloud.
