The winners of the Awards for Technological Innovation NetEvents

From the "Ethernet Idol", Andy Bechtolsheim, Verizon, for "Best New Carrier Ethernet Business Service", eight categories of winners were announced during a gala dinner that took place 40 years Ethernet Innovation.

The winners of the awards for Technology Innovation NetEvents 2013 were announced at a gala dinner held at the Museum of the History of Computing in Mountain View, United States, in which it held 40 years of innovation originated and fostered by Ethernet.

The prestigious award recognizes the work of organizations and individuals who stand out internationally for innovation in networking and telecommunications sectors. All funds raised by way of nominations for the award, gala dinner and charity auction were donated to the educational project STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM)).

The awards event, held in the framework of the celebration of the 40th anniversary of Ethernet - witnessed by users around the world thanks to transmission services and Tata Communications, Comcast included an honorary award for "the greatest contribution made the network age, "presented by Bob Metcalfe, co-inventor of Ethernet and Professor of Innovation at the University of Austin, Texas.

It is also awarded to the individual who, in the opinion of the jury, has successfully collected the inspiration of the original inventors, making an exceptional contribution to Ethernet over the past 15 years. The winner was Andy Bechtolsheim, considered a legend in the industry.

In presenting the award to Bechtolsheim, Bob Metcalfe said: "It is ironic that Andy is honored for his work during the LAST 15 years of Ethernet, considering that Ethernet was my idol during the FIRST 15 years."

In its press release, NetEvents writes: "All these categories were evaluated by an independent panel of judges comprised of prominent industry gurus of IT and senior representatives of major international technology media, analysts and organizations also . For categories 'hottest new networking company' and 'Ethernet Idol', the final decision was the result of a vote conducted among more than 300 delegates attending the gala dinner. "

The celebration of the 40th Anniversary of Ethernet took place last week in Mountain View and included a conference on innovation from the invention made by Bob Metcalfe and other scientists on May 22, 1973. On May 23, the IT media representatives were invited to select a series of roundtable sessions and interviews with leading players in the networking industry.
